Leatherback turtle meat used as food in south Kerala

The capture of a large turtle in shore seine on 11.12.02 A female leatherback turtle, accidentally caught and at about 07.00 hrs at Pallithura, 10 km south of landed on September 30, 2002, was sold in the Vizhinjam, was reported in a local newspaper. One Kattakada fish market, as food. The turtle, which was of the authors visited Pallithura at 08.30 hrs to collect landed at Vizhinjam, Kerala, was sold at the site for information about the turtle. The turtle was a male Rs. 500.00. The turtle was then butchered and packed leatherback (*Dermochelys coriacea*), measuring 200 in bamboo baskets with ice. It was transported to the cm in total length. The turtle was released back into Kattakkada fish market, 20 km west of Vizhinjam, on October 3, 2002 and sold at Rs. 20 per kg. Undeveloped eggs of the turtle were also sold. Fleshy parts of the head were also cut into pieces and sold. The carapace and plastron were discarded in Vizhinjam and were later retrieved by a local diver for CMFRI. The carapace measured 141 cm in length and 106 cm in width.
